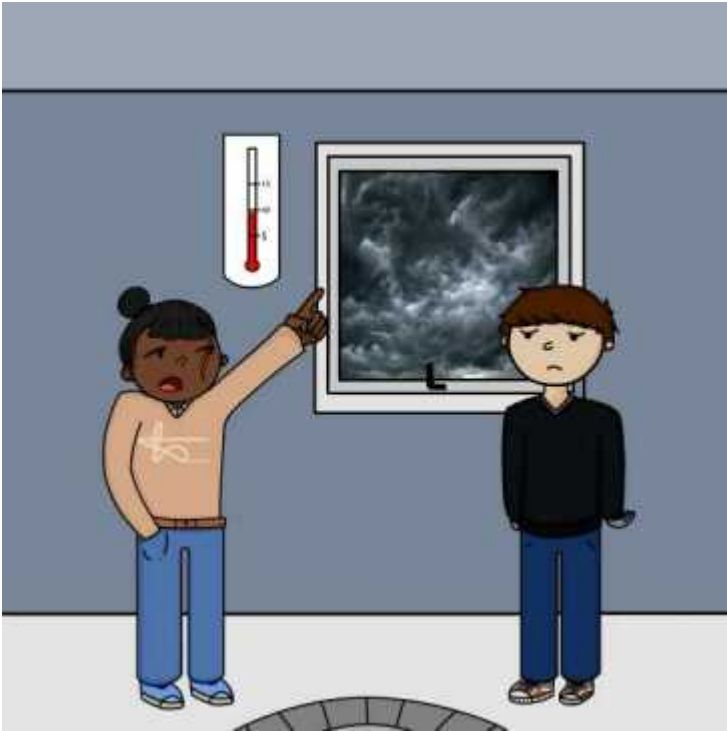
“It’s nine degrees. It’s still autumn, but soon it will be winter.”
