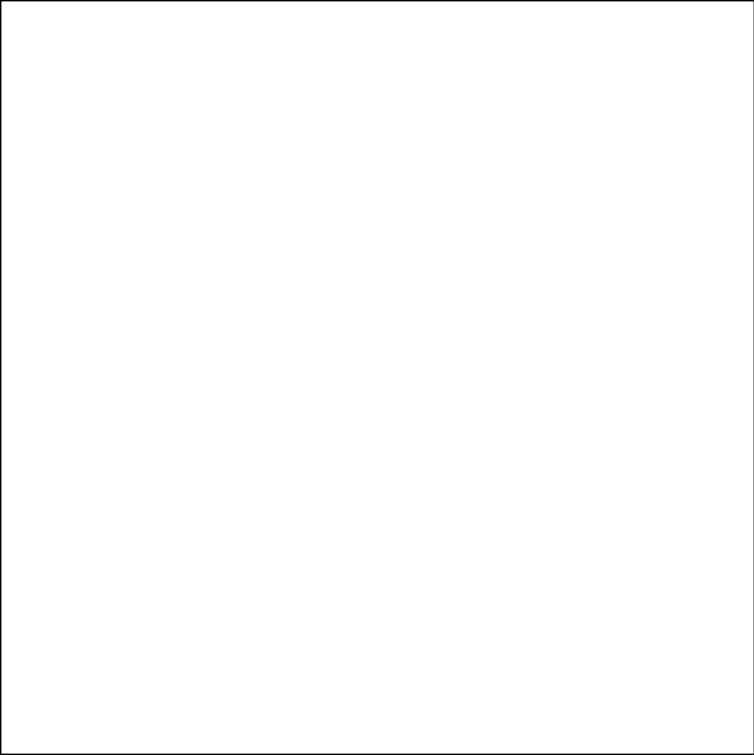
"Anch'io ho due figlie, ma sono divorziata."

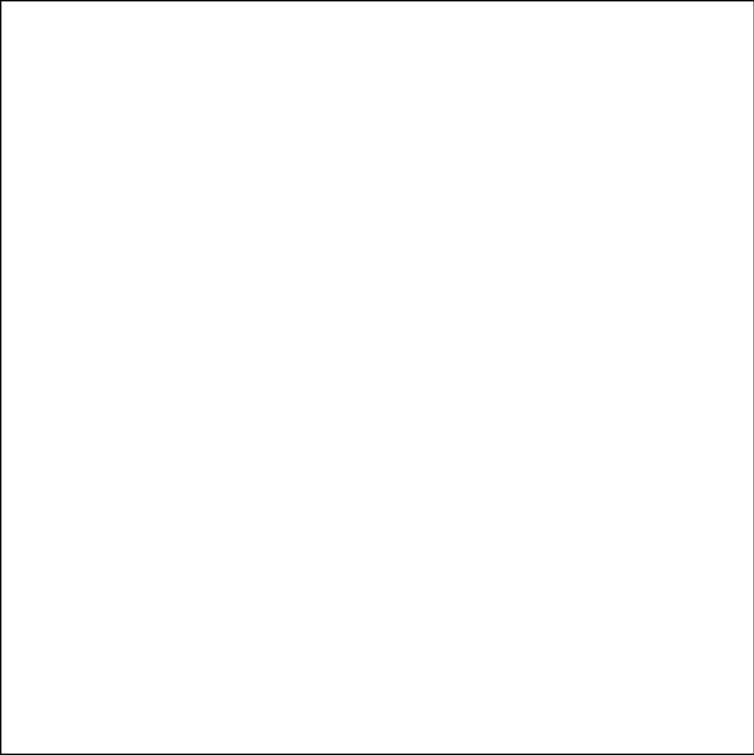
“Mina ha quattro anni. Va alla scuola materna.

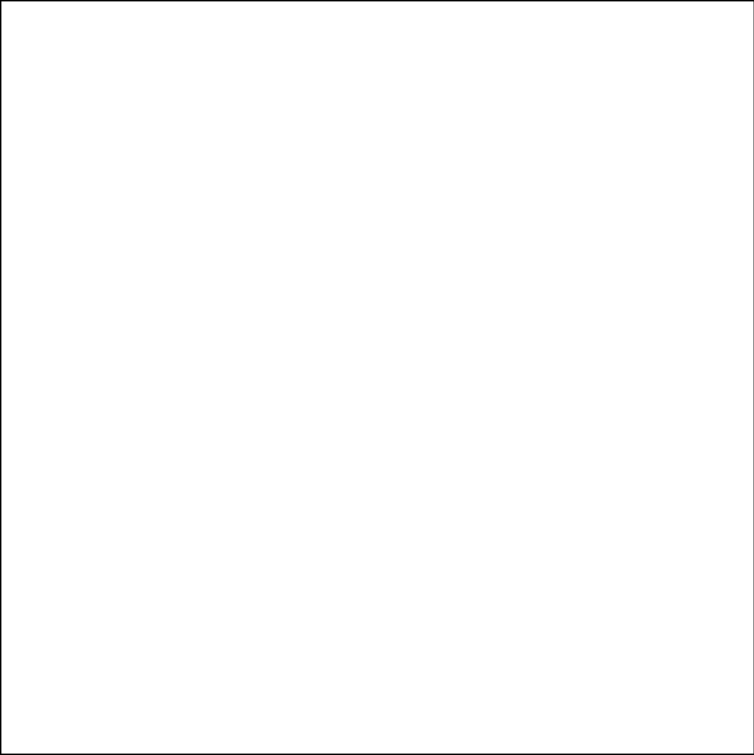
“Tutti i miei figli sono a scuola. Mio figlio si diploma l'anno prossimo.”

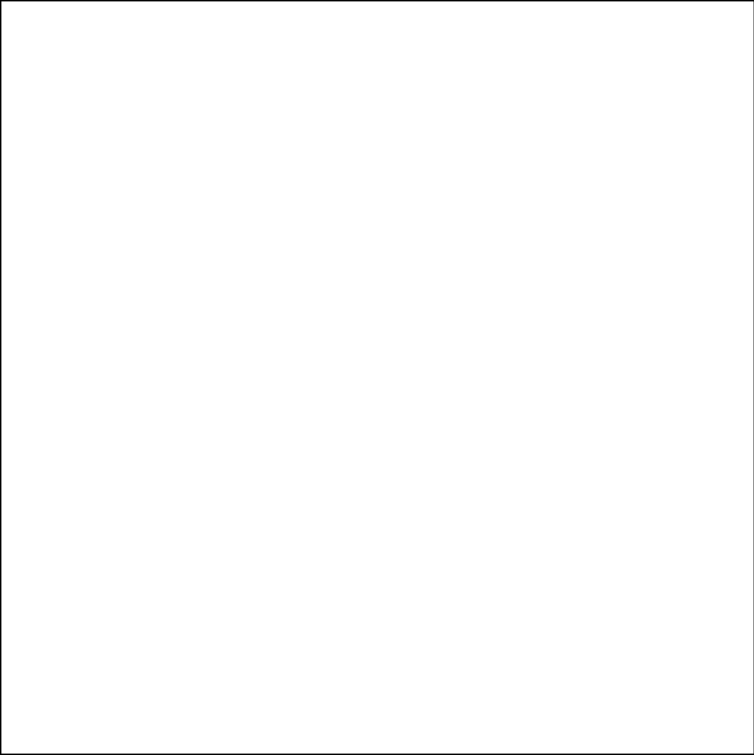
“Ottimo! Crescono così in fretta. Cosa vuole fare dopo?”
